




trim fitted diaper

The most adjustable one-size fitted diapers on the market!

Always start with tag facing away from baby.



To adjust the diaper to fit newborns:

1. Leave out the snap-in liner.
2. On both sides, snap A to C.

To adjust the diaper to fit crawlers:

1. Leave out or include the snap-in liner.
2. On both sides, snap A to B.

To adjust the diaper to fit toddlers:

1. Leave out or include the snap-in liner.
2. Leave fully extended.

Waist Adjustments to Fit All Three Sizes

To close waist, use corresponding snaps or hook-and-loop closure for a snug fit.

Snap-in Liner

To use snap-in liner, snap 1 to 2 on both sides.

For very small babies, use snap-in liner as a diaper inside a newborn cover.

Tiny Tush Tips!

- ✔ For added comfort and dryness, roll the leg bands in toward the center of the diaper to create a secure cotton wall. This will contain even the biggest messes.
- ✔ A diaper cover should be used with this cloth diaper.

First Use:

- ✔ Wash and dry diapers several times prior to first use so diapers reach their maximum absorbency and softness.

Washing:

- ✔ Always rinse soiled diapers in cold water.
- ✔ To prevent staining, use Tiny Tush biodegradable diaper liners.
- ✔ Use 1/4 the suggested detergent amount and add an extra rinse cycle when heavily soiled.

Cotton and hemp fabric will need to be washed/primed prior to use. This will remove natural oils and ensure diapers reach maximum absorbency prior to using them. The amount of prep washings required will depend on the type of detergent used and hardness of your water.

The fabric is ready (primed) when you pour small amounts of water in several spots and it absorbs instantly upon contact. If the water beads, it is not completely primed and will need to be washed a few more times. Repeat these steps until the fabric absorbs the water on contact. Do not wash new diapers with diapers already primed or with pocket diapers.

- ✔ Avoid fabric softeners and dryer sheets as they leave a coating on fabric causing diapers to leak. If they are used in your machines for other laundry, they will coat the inside of your machines and transfer the coating to the diapers.
- ✔ Avoid using diaper cream. If you find that you need to use a diaper cream, use a barrier such as disposable diaper liners to prevent staining of the diapers.
- ✔ Less detergent is the key to rash free cloth diapering.
- ✔ To prevent Velcro® or Aplix® closure diapers from tangling, and to reduce the lint build-up in the tabs, be sure to fasten the fold-back tabs prior to laundering.
- ✔ By adding an extra spin cycle to the washing cycle and adding a clean dry towel to your dryer, you can reduce the drying time up to 25%. Line dry diapers to save on drying cost.
